Overview of the College and Geographical Location

A. Establishment: The College of Pharmacy at Al-Bayan University was established to serve as a beacon for distinguished pharmaceutical education, with the objective of supplying the health sector and state institutions with highly competent pharmacists who possess a robust scientific and practical background.

B. Educational Environment: The college features an integrated environment and laboratories equipped with state-of-the-art technologies to teach various pharmaceutical sciences and keep pace with the scientific revolution.

C. Geographical Location: The college is situated within the distinguished campus of Al-Bayan University in (The Capital, Baghdad - Al-Karkh Side - Baghdad International Airport Road), adjacent to other medical and health colleges in an architectural layout that offers an ideal environment for joint training.

Strategic Framework

A. Vision: Leadership and excellence in pharmaceutical education and applied scientific research, to attain a prominent position among colleges of pharmacy both locally and regionally.



B. Mission: Preparing highly qualified pharmacists capable of providing distinguished therapeutic services and conducting innovative scientific research that contributes to community service and the advancement of pharmaceutical industries.

C. Objectives: Equipping students with fundamental and applied pharmaceutical knowledge and skills.

Fostering creative thinking and research capabilities.

Promoting the values of integrity and ethical responsibility in professional practice.

Collaborating with health and syndical institutions to elevate the standard of health care.

Admission Requirements

The college admits its students in accordance with the regulations approved by the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research, through the following channels:

A. Central Admission: For students graduating from preparatory school (Biological Branch exclusively) and schools for the gifted.

B. Expatriates Channel: For students holding equivalent non-Iraqi preparatory certificates.

C. External Transfer: For students desiring to transfer their studies from universities outside Iraq in accordance with the stipulated regulations.

D. Top Students on Medical Equivalency.

E. General Limitations:

Nationality Requirement: The applicant must be a holder of Iraqi citizenship.

Academic Documents: The applicant must hold an Iraqi preparatory study certificate, authenticated legally by the General Directorate of Education in the relevant governorate, or present a recognized equivalent academic certificate.

Age Requirement: The applicant must be born in the year 1998 or subsequent years.

Medical Fitness: Successfully passing the medical examination, based on the strict health conditions and standards specific to each academic program.



Academic Dedication (Full-Time Study): Full-time dedication to academic study is mandatory; it is strictly prohibited to combine employment and study in morning programs (colleges and institutes). This regulation encompasses all employees of government institutions, who are obligated to secure an official study leave from their respective departments in advance to ensure their continuation, in accordance with the enforced instructions. Furthermore, dual registration in two academic programs simultaneously is prohibited, and should any violation be proven, an official request will be submitted to the Ministry to revoke the admission immediately.

Graduation Year: The applicant must be a graduate of the current academic year.

Procedures for Expatriate Students: Expatriate students for the academic year (2022/2023) are permitted to apply via the electronic portal of the Department of Studies, Planning, and Follow-up utilizing the designated form. The electronic application is officially recognized following the provision of a temporary equivalency certificate issued by the Ministry of Education (Directorate of Equivalency and Certificates). Regarding graduates from the preceding year, admission applications are to be submitted exclusively through the Central Admission Department (Expatriates Division).

Financial Obligations for Non-Iraqi Students: Non-Iraqi students holding an Iraqi preparatory certificate and accepted under the central admission system will be formally notified in writing of the imperative to visit the Central Admission Department (Expatriates Division) to settle their financial status. This will determine whether they are exempt or obligated to pay tuition fees in foreign currency, based on the regulations and legislation detailed in Chapter Seven of the Student Affairs Procedures and Admission Regulations Guide.

Controls for the Application of Martyrs' Families covered by the provisions of Law No. (57) of 2015 and Law No. (2) of 2016, amended by Law No. (2) of 2020:

Covered Categories: These regulations are strictly limited to the categories outlined below:

- A. Families of martyrs who fell victim to the crimes of the dissolved Baath party.
- B. Families of martyrs of the Popular Mobilization Forces.
- C. Victims of military operations, military errors, and terrorist acts, in addition to the wounded covered by the provisions of Law No. (57) of 2015.



Admission Quotas: An independent quota of (10%) of the total admission plan is allocated for the application and admission of the categories referenced in Paragraph (1) above, provided that direct academic competition for available seats occurs separately within each specific category.

Academic Competition Criteria: Students shall compete for admission seats based on the following criteria:

A. Medical Group Colleges (Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy): Competition is permitted with a grade average variance not exceeding (5) marks below the approved minimum admission threshold for these colleges within the central admission system for the academic year (2026/2027), provided the student's basic cumulative average is no less than (90%) prior to the addition of any bonus marks.

B. Other Specialties: Competition is permitted with a grade average variance not exceeding (7) marks below the minimum admission threshold in the respective college or institute within the central admission system for the academic year (2026/2027).

Authentication Procedures: Upon completion of the electronic application, the student is strictly required to visit the Martyrs Foundation to finalize the official authentication procedures for the application. Failure to comply will result in the admission pathway being automatically redirected to fall under the general channel regulations (Central Admission).

Requirements for Commencing Study: A student admitted under the martyrs' families' channels is prohibited from officially commencing their studies until an official endorsement letter issued by the Directorates of the Martyrs Foundation (Scientific Care Divisions) is submitted. This letter serves as the final documentation validating the admission and will be permanently retained in the student's academic file.

Direct Admission System: The admission mechanism for students from martyrs' families, in accordance with the categories specified in Paragraph (1) above, is applicable to colleges and academic institutions that utilize the direct admission system.



Requirements for Completing the Registration File

The accepted student is required to visit the Registration Division bringing the following documents:

Student registration for the academic year 2026 - 2027

Required Documents for Registration: A student accepted into the College of Pharmacy must submit the following official documents and records:

A. Original Preparatory Study Certificate: It must be officially authenticated by the General Directorate of Education in the respective governorate, or the originals of other approved documents corresponding to the admission channel. Authenticated documents must be submitted no later than (13 / 4 / 2027), accompanied by a written pledge to that effect to the Registration Division at the college; failure to do so will result in the cancellation of admission.

B. Financial Guarantee (Sponsorship): It must be organized according to an approved template from the Legal Affairs Department at the University, provided that its clauses include a legal provision holding the student accountable for safeguarding state property and abstaining from tampering with it. Otherwise, the student shall bear all financial consequences and fines for any ensuing damages.

C. Identification Documents: A color copy of the Iraqi Nationality Certificate and the Civil Status ID, or the Unified National Card.

D. Personal Photos: Six (6) recent personal photographs.

E. Medical Examination Form: Organized in accordance with the Health Fitness System No. (5) of 1992 and its specific conditions and controls, strictly observing the following points:

1- Registration of the student is absolutely prohibited if the form is not submitted. The submission of the original copy is mandatory; no photocopied versions will be accepted.

2- The result of the medical examination is approved directly by the entity to which the student has been nominated. Should it be established that the student is medically unfit for the nominated field of study, coordination will be made with the Central Admission Department to adjust their nomination in alignment with their health fitness.



3- The student retains the right to appeal the outcome of the medical examination before the Committees Department or the Appellate Committee at the Ministry of Health, processed through the entity to which they were nominated for admission.

Student Services and Supportive Environment

1- Distribution of Methodological Books: The College of Pharmacy is perpetually dedicated to updating its academic curricula annually to remain aligned with the rapid scientific advancements in the pharmaceutical field. The college is committed to procuring the most recent scientific books and resources necessitated by these updates, ensuring they are accessible to students based on available capacities. These resources are categorized into two primary groups: the first group is designated for the college library to augment it with the latest scientific references and literature, whereas the second group comprises extensive quantities of prescribed methodological textbooks that are distributed directly to the students. The college emphasizes its continuous commitment to supplying adequate quantities that cover all academic stages, thereby guaranteeing that scientific materials reach every student.

2- Student ID: During the initial days of their academic journey, following their actual commencement of studies, each student is issued an official university ID designated for use within the campus premises. This ID remains valid for two academic years, after which it is replaced with an updated ID. This cyclical process continues until the student's graduation from the college, at which point the ID is permanently revoked.

3- Endorsement Letter: The endorsement letter is an official document issued by the college upon the student's request, addressed to a specified official entity. This document certifies the student's continuous enrollment in the college and verifies the academic stage they are currently attending. The college administration handles the provision of the requested endorsement letter through the office of the Assistant Dean for Scientific Affairs.

4- Dormitories: The college actively coordinates on a continuous basis to secure alternative housing (dormitories) for expatriate students relocating from distant governorates and regions. This initiative aims to cultivate an appropriate residential environment that bolsters their academic trajectory and guarantees a secure atmosphere.



Academic Systems and Absences

1- Transfer between Colleges:

A. Procedures governing transfers between colleges across Iraqi universities are subject to centralized regulations established by the Ministry, which are subject to annual review.

B. These regulations are designed to prioritize the student's best interests, offering the broadest possible opportunity for enrollment in colleges and institutes situated closer to their geographical residence.

C. This measure is instrumental in alleviating the burdens and challenges students might face, thereby affording them an enhanced opportunity to concentrate on their academic performance and elevate their scientific proficiency.

D. The Ministry outlines structured mechanisms wherein students are categorized into specific classifications according to their individual circumstances.

2- Re-nomination:

A. This process constitutes a privilege exclusively granted to first-year students in colleges and institutes who found themselves unable to proceed with their studies in their current specialization (whether due to postponement or failing the first academic year).

B. The objective of this process is to facilitate their re-nomination to pursue an alternative specialization located within or near their area of residence.

C. This operation is executed under the direct supervision of the Department of Studies and Planning at the Ministry.

D. Applications are processed via specific electronic forms designed to allocate a new specialization for the student, aligning with their preferences and competitive academic average.

3- Attendance and Absences:

A. The educational framework in Iraqi universities and institutes mandates compulsory daily attendance; distance education protocols are categorically unrecognized.



B. It is imperative that the student maintains an attendance record of no less than 90% of the total scheduled hours for all theoretical and practical courses.

C. The academic year is bifurcated into two semesters, each spanning 15 weeks, integrated with a series of daily and monthly examinations designed to evaluate the student's progressive academic standing leading up to final examinations.

D. The college administration assumes responsibility for monitoring student attendance; should an individual's absences exceed 10% of the prescribed annual hours for any given subject without a documented legitimate excuse, they shall be deemed to have failed that specific course.

E. Upon the submission of an official, corroborated, and accepted excuse, the student is permitted an absence threshold reaching a maximum of 15% of the annual hours. Any absence surpassing this limit dictates an automatic failure; absence calculations are managed in direct coordination with the respective course instructor.

Field Development and Academic Guidance

1- Postponement of the Academic Year: Should a student be unable to maintain academic attendance for any reason, and in the interest of safeguarding their academic standing and preventing failure due to absence, regulations afford the student the option to defer their studies to the subsequent academic year. The Ministry has vested the authority in the councils of colleges and institutes to review postponement requests. The student is obliged to submit an official petition accompanied by all evidentiary documents substantiating the grounds for the request; the approval or rejection of such petitions falls exclusively within the discretionary purview of the College Council.

2- Summer Training: Recognizing the paramount importance of practical application within the pharmaceutical sciences, and to facilitate students' direct engagement with professional environments, a mandatory summer training curriculum has been established for students in their third and fourth academic stages. The primary objective of this program is to assimilate students into practical work settings within relevant institutions and sectors, thereby exposing them to authentic operational conditions and professional challenges correlating with their academic studies.

A. Summer Training for the Third Stage: The program spans a duration of (30) days during the summer recess and is executed either within private pharmacies or government healthcare centers situated in regions devoid of private pharmaceutical establishments.



B. Summer Training for the Fourth Stage: The program spans a duration of (6) weeks during the summer recess and is conducted exclusively within private pharmacies. A specialized committee comprised of college faculty members oversees coordination with the Pharmacists Syndicate to assign appropriate training venues and monitor student attendance. Furthermore, student performance is meticulously assessed via a dedicated evaluation form that is transmitted directly to the college administration.

3- Visiting the College Library and the University Library: Students are encouraged to leverage the resources housed within the university's central library as well as the college library, checking out supplementary texts to aid their academic progress.

A. The borrowing protocol requires presenting oneself to the college librarian while in possession of the official university student ID.

B. A specialized library identification card is issued, retaining validity for one academic year and requiring annual renewal.

C. Students are permitted to borrow a maximum of two books for a period of one week, with the provision for a one-week extension upon completion of a designated renewal form.

D. The library features an air-conditioned reading hall, affording students the environment to consult available scientific literature and periodicals.

4- Extracurricular Activities: The college provides facilities for students to engage in athletic pursuits within an indoor hall equipped for table tennis and various other sports. The sports unit actively orchestrates annual competitions and tournaments encompassing scientific branches and varied colleges, featuring sports such as football and volleyball. Additionally, the college deanship organizes scientific and recreational excursions for the collective student body and faculty members.

5- Educational and Academic Counseling System: The mandate of the College of Pharmacy transcends merely the scientific and practical development of the student, extending to the cultivation of their character to ensure seamless future societal integration. This comprehensive system entails continuous monitoring of the student throughout their academic tenure, assisting in overcoming potential social challenges, and dispensing necessary guidance and counsel. The college appoints dedicated educational counselors from among the faculty members for each respective academic stage, the details of which are officially promulgated to the students at the



commencement of the academic year.

Examination Regulations and Evaluation Controls

1- Teaching System: The college operates on a Semester System framework, wherein the academic year is partitioned into two distinct semesters, each possessing a duration of 15 weeks. Every semester features two primary examinations (midterm and final), in addition to unannounced daily assessments.

2- Instructions for Participating in Exams: Students are strictly bound by the ensuing regulations whilst undertaking examinations:

Mandatory presence at the examination venue at least 15 minutes prior to the scheduled commencement.

Admission to the examination hall is absolutely prohibited absent the presentation of a valid university ID.

Entry into the examination hall is forbidden once one-quarter of the allocated examination time has elapsed.

Students are prohibited from exiting the hall prior to the expiration of half the allotted examination time.

The introduction of any textbooks, loose papers, notes, or summaries (unless explicitly dictated by the nature of the examination and expressly sanctioned by the proctor), as well as any data storage devices, dictionaries, translation devices, or programmable calculators, is strictly interdicted.

Mobile telephones are categorically prohibited; possession of a mobile phone is construed as an attempt at academic dishonesty, and the penalties codified in Article 20 shall be enforced upon the possessor.

Students must arrive equipped with all necessary writing and drawing materials; the exchange of implements between examinees is forbidden.

Verbal communication between students within the confines of the examination hall is prohibited.

Glancing at the examination papers or materials of fellow students is forbidden.



Any conduct that compromises the integrity of the examination process or incites disruption is prohibited; offending students will be summarily expelled from the hall.

Apprehending a student in the act of cheating results in immediate disqualification from continuing the examination, referral to an investigative committee, and an automatic failing grade in the pertinent subject.

3- Prominent Applicable Examination Instructions (Instructions No. 134 of 2000 and its amendments):

Article (6):

The minimum passing grade threshold is established at 50% for every subject.

Article (8):

First: A student who fails in half of their subjects (or fewer) is granted permission to undertake second-round examinations in those specific subjects.

Second: A student is deemed to have failed if they are unsuccessful in either the first or second examination round and are consequently obligated to repeat the entire academic year (encompassing both attendance and examinations) for all failed subjects, as well as those in which they merely achieved an 'Acceptable' rating.

Third A: A failing student is absolved from the requirement of completing subjects that have been excised due to curriculum modifications, and shall not be evaluated on them subsequently, provided this omission does not impede the fulfillment of advancement or graduation prerequisites, unless said subject is a mandatory component of the revised curriculum.

Fourth A: Should a student successfully pass all subjects associated with their current stage, they shall advance to the subsequent academic level, whilst remaining obligated to clear any previously failed subjects (if applicable from a lower level); they must successfully complete these pending subjects in the following year, irrespective of their success in the advanced subjects.

Article (9):

A student shall be considered to have failed a subject should their unexcused absences exceed (10%) of the total hours allocated to that subject, or (15%) in instances where a legitimate excuse has been formally recognized and approved by the college or



institute council.

Article (10):

A student is prohibited from sitting for second-round examinations unless their absence during the first round was justified by a legitimate excuse formally recognized by the college or institute, and corroborated by official documentation, strictly limited to the following circumstances:

Sudden illness.

Demise of a first-degree relative.

Traffic (run-over) accidents.

Sudden scheduling conflicts.

Article (11):

Subjects inherently characterized by practical or applied methodologies, which fundamentally lack a final examination component, are exempted from second-round examinations, in accordance with the stipulations articulated by the College Council at the inception of the academic year and subsequently communicated to the student body.

Article (12):

The postponement of a second-round examination is strictly prohibited under any conceivable circumstance.

Article (13):

A punitive deduction of (10) marks shall be exacted from the final grade of any subject passed by a student during the second round, with the sole exception being instances where a student achieves a precise score of (50%), in which case the grade remains unaltered.

Article (15) - Calculating the GPA and Units:

1- The student's academic average is computed based upon the grades achieved across the various subjects, factoring in the designated unit weight of each respective course.



2- An academic unit is defined as one hour of theoretical academic endeavor per week, sustained over a period of (15) weeks.

3- The equivalency stands at two practical hours corresponding to one theoretical hour, whilst three practical hours correspond to one and a half theoretical hours.

Article (16) - Graduation Rank:

The cumulative graduation rank is calculated by multiplying a student's GPA for each academic year by a predetermined percentage, detailed as follows:

First Year: 5%.

Second Year: 10%.

Third Year: 15%.

Fourth Year: 30%.

Fifth Year: 40%.

The aggregate sum of the products derived from these percentages constitutes the student's final graduation average.

Article (17): Scientific Appreciations (Grades)

Academic outcomes are publicized utilizing the following grading scale to precisely demarcate the student's scholastic standing:

Excellent: (90 - 100)

Very Good: (80 - 89)

Good: (70 - 79)

Medium (Fair): (60 - 69)

Acceptable (Pass): (50 - 59)

Fail: (49 and below)

**Article (19): Termination of Study Relationship**

A student's academic affiliation with the college or institute is subject to termination in either of the following scenarios:

If the student incurs failure for two consecutive years within the same academic stage.

If the student's tenure exceeds the maximum permissible duration for study, defined as one and a half times the prescribed duration for the specialization, inclusive of years of failure. Exclusions to this rule are granted for years of official postponement and non-failing years; this provision is applicable to all students admitted from the academic year 2004/2005 onwards (in accordance with the third amendment to Instructions No. 157 of 2004).

Article (20): Examination Cheating

Should conclusive evidence demonstrate that a student has engaged in, or attempted to engage in, academic dishonesty during any examination assessment (be it daily, weekly, monthly, semester, or final), said student shall be automatically designated as failing in all subjects comprising that specific academic year. In the event of recidivism, the student shall be subjected to final expulsion from the college or institute, resulting in the permanent expungement of their enrollment records.

Article (21): Study Postponement

The procedure for deferring academic studies is governed by the following controls:

For the First Year: A student is entitled to request a one-year postponement of their studies based on legitimate grounds deemed convincing by the College Council, conditional upon the submission of said request a minimum of 30 days prior to the commencement of final examinations.

For the Second Year: Studies may be deferred for an additional year due to legitimate circumstances, contingent upon approval by the University President after a recommendation from the College Council, provided the application is lodged no less than 30 days prior to the onset of final examinations.

Semester System: Academic postponement within institutions operating on a semester system is strictly prohibited during the second semester, barring instances of force majeure, or if the student successfully navigated the first semester; in the latter



scenario, the postponement encompasses the entirety of the academic year.

University Code of Conduct and General Appearance

A- Instructions on Student Discipline in the Institutions of the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research No. (160) for the year 2007

Article - 1 - The student is obligated to the following:

First: Strict adherence to all laws, internal bylaws, directives, and mandates issued by the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research and its subsidiary institutions (University, Commission, College, Institute).

Second: Refraining absolutely from any infringement upon religious convictions, national unity, or national sentiments, and abstaining from any intentional incitement of sectarian or ethnic discord through either spoken word or action.

Third: Ensuring no harm befalls the reputation of the Ministry or its institutions through any statements or actions executed either within or beyond its premises.

Fourth: Actively eschewing any conduct contradictory to the expected university ethos, maintaining an elevated standard of discipline, and exhibiting profound respect towards the administration, pedagogical staff, and personnel, while fostering robust relations of collegiality and cooperation amongst the student body.

Fifth: Maintaining upright and disciplined behavior, which inherently yields a positive influence upon future employment prospects and nominations for academic missions and fellowships.

Sixth: Categorically refraining from any activities that threaten to compromise order and tranquility within the campus environs (college or institute), avoiding participation in, instigation of, or obfuscation for those involved in such acts.

Seventh: Exercising rigorous care over academic resources and safeguarding the property belonging to the University, Commission, College, or Institute.

Eighth: Ensuring no disruption to the seamless progression of academic instruction within the college or institute.

Ninth: Complying meticulously with the mandated unified academic dress code, with due consideration to the specific requirements of each individual university or



commission.

Tenth: Abstaining from any advocacy for entities whose objective is the exacerbation of division, and refusing participation in any form of political, religious, or social persecution.

Eleventh: Avoiding involvement in promotional campaigns for any political party, organization, or ethnic, national, or sectarian faction, whether manifested through the display of imagery, banners, placards, or the convening of symposia.

Twelfth: Refraining from inviting politically affiliated figures to deliver lectures and avoiding the organization of partisan or religious propaganda seminars within the university campus, thereby ensuring the preservation of national cohesion.

Article - 2 - The student shall be penalized with a Warning if they commit any of the following infractions:

First: Non-compliance with the prescribed unified uniform mandated within the University or Commission.

Second: Detrimently affecting the amicable relations among the student body, or engaging in verbal transgression against a fellow student.

Article - 3 - The student shall be penalized with a Reprimand if they commit any of the following infractions:

First: Engaging in behavior warranting a Warning penalty, subsequent to having already been subjected to a previous Warning.

Second: Breaching the established order, serenity, and peace within the University, Commission, College, or Institute.

Article - 4 - The student shall be penalized with suspension for a period of (30) days if they commit any of the following infractions:

First: Engaging in behavior warranting a Reprimand penalty, subsequent to having already been subjected to a previous Reprimand.

Second: Directing verbal abuse toward any university employee who is not classified as a member of the teaching faculty.



Third: Initiating defamation against a member of the teaching faculty in a manner that constitutes an insult, whether occurring within the confines of the college or externally.

Fourth: The unauthorized placement of posters within the campus perimeter that contravene public order and accepted morals.

Article - 5 - The student shall be penalized with temporary expulsion from the university for a duration not exceeding one academic year if they commit any of the following infractions:

First: Recidivism involving any of the offenses articulated in Article (4) of these regulatory instructions.

Second: Engaging in or fomenting the creation of sectarian or ethnic factions or organizing political or partisan assemblies within the university grounds.

Third: Committing a physical assault against any university employee who is not classified as a member of the teaching faculty.

Fourth: Deploying violence against fellow students.

Fifth: Articulating threats pertaining to the execution of armed violence.

Sixth: The possession of weaponry of any classification, irrespective of licensure status, within the university campus.

Seventh: Purposely, or through significant negligence, inflicting damage upon the assets of the University, Commission, College, or Institute.

Eighth: Demonstrating disrespect toward national unity or religious convictions.

Ninth: Directing verbal abuse toward members of the teaching faculty, whether occurring within the confines of the college/institute or externally.

Tenth: Inflicting harm upon the reputational standing of the University or Commission through verbal expressions or physical actions.

Eleventh: Intentional interference with the seamless progression of academic instruction.



Twelfth: Verified involvement in fraudulent or deceptive practices targeting fellow students or personnel of the college or institute.

Article - 6 - The student shall be subjected to final expulsion from the college or institute, enacted by a formal decision from the University or Commission, if they commit any of the following infractions:

First: The repeated commission of any of the offenses detailed in Article (5) of these regulatory instructions.

Second: Committing a physical assault against a member of the teaching faculty or lecturers operating within the University, Commission, College, or Institute.

Third: The execution of a disgraceful act that fundamentally contradicts established morals and public decency.

Fourth: The submission of any falsified documents, correspondence, or records with full cognizance of their fraudulent nature, or active complicity in orchestrating such forgery.

Fifth: Verified involvement in an action that severely compromises the security and tranquility of the university campus, including participation in or facilitation of such acts.

Sixth: Upon conviction of a felony or misdemeanor that entails moral turpitude, provided the resultant period of incarceration exceeds one year.

B. Unified Academic Uniform: In strict adherence to an appropriate university identity, students are obligated to don modest and dignified academic attire commencing from their initial day of attendance. This uniform must reflect the inherent dignity of a university scholar and align seamlessly with the overarching central directives established for the Al-Bayan University campus.
